Guiding Principles Plus

Proactively applied the principles to essential and front-line workers.

- Protecting <u>health care workers</u> who fill a critical role in caring for and preserving the lives of COVID-19 patients and maintaining the health care infrastructure for all who need it.
- Protecting <u>front-line workers</u> who are at greater risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the nature of their work providing critical services and preserving the economy.
- <u>Protecting vulnerable populations</u> who are at greater risk of severe disease and death if they contract COVID-19.
- <u>Mitigating health inequities</u> due to factors such as demographics, poverty, insurance status and geography.
- Data-driven allocations using the best available scientific evidence and epidemiology at the time, allowing for <u>flexibility</u> for local conditions.
- <u>Geographic diversity</u> through a balanced approach that considers access in urban and rural communities and in affected ZIP codes.
- <u>Transparency</u> through sharing allocations with the public and seeking public feedback.









COVID-19 Vaccine Hesitancy Education Campaign



- In our efforts in Public and Media Relations, we created and launched a robust public service campaign, in both English and Spanish, to target the general population.
- The campaign was culturally responsive to influences and biases of COVID-19 vaccination hesitancy.
- This series of produced video and print assets included diverse faculty experts from multiple schools within our health science center.
- These assets were used internally and sent externally to media outlets and community organizations willing to help us spread the word.
- Since September 2020, approximately 70 diverse faculty experts from multiple schools within our health science center participated in more than 370 COVID-19 specific media stories.
- Since April 2021, our social media campaign targeting young adults with videos and article posts saw approximately 373,000 views and a click through rate of over 3,000 to our COVID-19 scheduling website.











Percent Vaccinated with at least One Dose in Bexar County




Percent Population Fully Vaccinated in Bexar County



Number (%) of people fully vaccinated: 784,115 (47.2%)




Percent Vaccinated by Age Group


