# Commission Overview



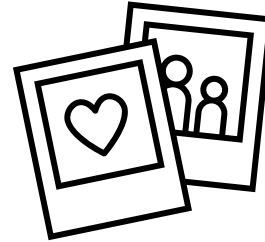
## SA2020 Commission on Education

- Established in 2013
- 11 Members
- Advises Mayor & City Council
- Focus on Issues affecting education



## Higher Education Student Advisory Board

- Established in 2018
- 11 Members
- Advises Mayor & City Council
- Focus on enrollment and retention of college students



## SA2020 Commission on Strengthening Family Well-Being

- Established in 2013
- 11 Members
- Advises Mayor & City Council
- Focus on matters affecting the well-being and stability of San Antonio residents and families



## San Antonio Youth Commission

- Established in 1991
- 22 Members
- Advises Mayor & City Council
- Focus on Youth Related Matters

# Name Changes for Two Commissions

- DHS staff discussed with commission members the potential to drop “SA2020” from both commissions’ names.
- SA2020 staff and commission members agreed that name changes are necessary to differentiate between the organization and the two City of San Antonio commissions.

# Bylaw Changes and Approval for Four Commissions

- DHS staff discussed with commission members the adoption of bylaws for each of the four commissions.
- Commission Members have approved the bylaw changes in the presentation for council consideration.

# SA2020 Commission on Education Accomplishments

- Members participated in RFP review panels to provide recommendations for the FY2018-20 Consolidated Funding Delegate Agency process in FY2017.
- Researched and presented to the Community, Health, and Equity committee regarding the internship atmosphere in San Antonio.
- Work on internships developed into the funding of a city-wide internship website in FY2021 which will be launched in 2022.
- Members actively participating in strategic planning of commission work for the 2021-23 commission year.

# SA2020 Commission on Strengthening Family Well-Being Accomplishments

- Collaborated with SA2020 on community-wide goals and metrics related to family well-being and stability
- Contributed to improvements in the structure and process for selection and oversight of nonprofit social service agencies funded under Department of Human Services Consolidated Funding in FY2018.
- Supported the DHS adoption of a trauma-informed-care service model and sponsored the acquisition of related training materials that were then utilized by DHS and the Metro Health Department in FY2018 and FY2019.
- Members participated in RFP review panels to provide recommendations for the FY2021-23 Consolidated Funding Delegate Agency process in FY2021.

# San Antonio Youth Commission Accomplishments

- Members participated in RFP review panels to provide recommendations for the FY2021-23 Consolidated Funding Delegate Agency process in FY2021.
- Researched and presented to the Community, Health, and Equity committee regarding the internship atmosphere in San Antonio.
- Created a teen voter challenge for the 2020 Presidential Election.
- Members actively participating in strategic planning of commission work for the 2021-23 commission year including a focus on teen mental health.

# Summary of Commission Bylaw Changes

## **Commission on Education**

- Remove all references to “SA2020”
- Align with current City Code that allows for unlimited terms

## **Commission on Strengthening Family Well-Being**

- Remove all references to “SA2020”
- Align with current City Code that allows for unlimited terms

# Commission Bylaw Changes (cont.)

## **San Antonio Youth Commission**

- Changes to align bylaws with other city commissions
- Change to how quorum is made to reflect quorum is made of a majority of appointed members

## **Higher Education Student Advisory Board**

- Simplify appointment process to align with other city commissions; no longer need referral from higher education institution's president's office
- Changes to align bylaws with other city commissions
