- An untreated mental health issue often has a costly impact on the individual and the community.
- The opportunity exists to support mental health services in San Antonio schools.

**Mental Health Matters** 



The San Antonio Metropolitan Health District's Violence
Prevention Program is contracting with the Meadows Mental
Health Policy Institute for Texas to implement the Mobile Mental
Wellness Collaborative (MMWC), a collaborative of local
nonprofits, to provide mental health services at no cost to
children in San Antonio schools.

Services will target children and communities that are disproportionately experiencing violence.





## Some of the services the collaboration will offer include:

- Mental health screenings and treatment
- Individual and support group on-site counseling
- Faculty/staff training to help screen students for behavioral health concerns
- Substance abuse prevention education and intervention
- Psychiatric medication management treatment and referrals
- Longer-term care, wraparound support, navigation assistance, and wellness education for parents/guardians



- The agreement with Meadows Mental Health Policy Institute for Texas is for a term ending on September 30, 2022.
- Initial term is for an amount of up to \$565,190.00.
- Includes a one-year renewal option for an amount of up to \$582,146.00.
- The total amount will be up to \$1,147,336.00 inclusive of the renewal.





- Funding for this service is allocated and available through the Health Disparities grant in the amount of \$500,000.00.
- Funding in the amount of \$315,190.00 has also been allocated in Metro Health's FY 2022 SA Forward Plan Budget.
- Additional funds in the amount of \$332,146.00.00 are subject to appropriation in the FY 2023 Metro Health Budget.





Staff recommends City Council approve the execution of the agreement with the Meadows Mental Health Policy Institute for Texas.
