Discussion and possible action on Housing Commission Fiscal Year 2024-2026 goals and priorities

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Housing Commission is charged with engaging the public in the development of affordable housing policy as well as other affordable housing issues and policies.

On October 11th the Housing Commission had a retreat to discuss key goals and priorities for Fiscal Year 2024-2026. The Commission asked staff to provide a summary of how their list of priorities would forward the progress of the Strategic Housing Implementation Plan (SHIP).

ISSUE:

During the Housing Commission's retreat, commissioners brainstormed areas of focus for their work and the work of the subcommittees, resulting in a draft list of priorities.

Below is a summary of possible priorities and SHIP overlap:
