TPV 21-145 Tree Preservation Variance for McCrary Subdivision Units 1, 2, 4, & 5

# **SUMMARY:**

Request by Mr. Sean McFarland, P.E., for approval of a tree preservation variance request from Unified Development Code 35-523 (h), "significant trees shall be preserved at eighty (80) percent and heritage trees at one hundred (100) percent preservation within both the 100-year floodplains and environmentally sensitive areas", general located off Swayback Ranch and Davis Ranch. ### **ISSUE:**

The applicant is requesting a Variance Request to mitigate for removal of significant tree stand more than the 80% preservation requirements within the 100-year Floodplain and to remove heritage trees in excess of the 100% preservation requirements within both the 100-year Floodplain and Environmental Sensitive Area (ESA) in place under the 2010 Tree Preservation Ordinance for construction of the McCrary Tract Subdivision Units 1, 2, 4, & 5.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

DSD staff supports the applicant's request to fall below 80% significant tree stand preservation within the 100-year Floodplain and to fall below 100% of heritage tree preservation requirements within both the 100-year Floodplain and ESA based on the proposed plan to meet tree mitigation requirements by planting trees on residential lots and exceeding final tree canopy cover requirements. The proposed Variance Request meets the intent and spirit of the Tree Ordinance therefore, staff recommends approval.
